One of the most beloved love stories of all time, ROMEO & JULIET is the classic Shakespearean tragedy of two young lovers divided by the quarrels of their warring families. This epic production is a visual spectacle with sweeping grand ballrooms, daring sword-fights, and romantic gardens serving as the backdrop for the classic tragedy. Sergei Prokofiev's lush score will be performed by The Phoenix Symphony with the full corps of Ballet Arizona's dancers performing Artistic Director Ib Andersen's original choreography.

The result is a fresh performance that remains true to both the treasured story and the classical ballet.
