DanceAZ

DanceAZ is a free in-school residency program tailored for Title 1 schools, offering students an immersive journey into dance, choreography, and performance fostering the development of character-building skills.

This year, Ballet Arizona increased its school partnerships from 8 to 9 schools reaching 131 students and 1,097 audience members.

Ballet Under the Stars & Class Act

Ballet Under the Stars brings fully staged performances to local-area parks around the Valley, making dance free and accessible to the Arizona community.



In conjunction with Ballet Under the Stars, Ballet Arizona partners with four elementary schools to bring Class Act to 3rd and 4th grade students. This year, Class Act provided **72 local elementary school children** with the opportunity to dance, create, and perform under the guidance of Ballet Arizona's dancers at the Ballet Under the Stars performance.

LIFELONG LEARNING PROGRAMS

This season has seen extraordinary participation in two of our Lifelong Learning initiatives: Creative Aging and Dance for Parkinson's Disease.

53 individuals participated in our Creative Aging through Dance program, working to build strength through mind and body, flexibility, and resilience.

39 individuals living with Parkinson's Disease and their caregivers participated this year, finding support, respite, and community through the practice of dance.

Q: What benefits are to be gained from this program?

A: Adults in the program enjoy revisiting all forms of dance. Many students practiced when they were younger, other dancers are just beginning and have always dreamed of being a ballerina. This is an opportunity to make all those dreams come true! Moving as an older adult can bring so much joy by learning a new hobby, moving your body through space, being creative, and appreciating the music.

Q: What has your experience been like teaching Creative Aging?

A: It is an exciting challenge to come up with ways to introduce material in a new, creative way. Ballet is for everyone! My hope is keeping our community moving in a way that not only benefits the body, but also heart and mind. Together we have a chance to share and continue to learn not only about ballet but, about each other's lives.

Q: What benefits are to be gained from this program?

- A: There can be anxiety, social isolation, and depression with Parkinson's. Music can help with depression and anxiety. Dance can help with socialization. The students are focused on learning new movements and combining them with the music.
- Q: What has your experience been like teaching Dance for Parkinson's Disease?
- A: I'm inspired every class when I see a group or even just one person achieve something they didn't think they could do. We have built a small community that supports one another and shares a passion for dance. They are family to me, I'm proud to be a part of the PD community!
