## The Sleeping Beauty Synopsis

#### Prologue

The King and Queen herald the birth of his daughter Aurora with a christening ceremony, and invite the fairies of the kingdom to bestow their gifts of beauty, grace, song, temperament and generosity upon the infant Princess. Catalabutte, the Master of Ceremonies, checks the invitation list to ensure that all is in order. In the midst of the celebration, the arrival of the evil fairy Carabosse interrupts the festivities. Angry because she has not been invited, Carabosse delivers a curse upon the tiny princess: she will grow up to be beautiful, but one day will prick her finger and die. The Lilac Fairy intervenes, promising that the princess will not die, but will sleep until awakened by a Prince's kiss of true love.

PAUSE —

#### Act I

It is Aurora's 16th birthday party. Her father informs her that she must select one of four visiting princes as her husband. Aurora dances with the princes, each of whom offers her a rose and declares his love.

In the midst of the festivities, Aurora is presented with a spindle from a stranger and, taking the present, pricks her finger. As Aurora collapses, the stranger reveals herself as Carabosse to the King and vanishes in triumph. The Lilac Fairy reminds the King that Aurora only slumbers, and casts a spell over the entire court to put them to sleep.

------INTERMISSION ------

#### Act II

One hundred years later, Prince Désiré is hunting in the forest with his friends. As the hunt moves on the Prince is left alone. To his amazement, the Lilac Fairy appears and conjures a vision of Princess Aurora. Enchanted by the vision, Prince Désiré begs the Lilac Fairy to lead him to Aurora.

As the Prince makes his way to the castle, he is confronted by Carabosse and the Lilac Fairy drives her away. Désiré sees the sleeping Aurora and awakens her with a kiss. True love prevails, and Princess Aurora accepts Prince Désiré's hand in marriage with the approval of the kingdom.

#### Act III

The court is celebrating the wedding of Princess Aurora and Prince Désiré. Characters from other fairy tales have joined to dance at the magnificent celebration. With the blessing of the Lilac Fairy, and their love sealed with a kiss, the new royal couple lives happily ever after.

## About The Sleeping Beauty

#### History of The Sleeping Beauty

The Sleeping Beauty first premiered at the Marinsky Theatre in St. Petersburg, Russia in 1890 and in 2010 by Ballet Arizona. It is considered by many to be one of the greatest classical ballets of all time. Based on Charles Perrault's La Belle au bois dormant, the ballet incorporates other fairy tale characters such as Little Red Riding Hood, Puss in Boots and Blue Bird. Although several versions exist, most ballet companies stage the ballet according to the choreography of Marius Petipa and Lev Ivanov from their St. Petersburg performance of 1890. The Sleeping Beauty is one of the longest classical ballets still performed; danced in a prologue, three acts, and an apotheosis, the original production is nearly three hours long and is always shortened.

#### The Music of Peter Ilyich Tchaikovsky

Peter Ilyich Tchaikovsky (May 7, 1840 – November 6, 1893) was a Russian composer of the Romantic era. Although not a member of the group of nationalistic composers usually known in English-speaking countries as The Mighty Five, his music has come to be known and loved for its distinctly Russian character as well as its rich harmonies and stirring melodies. His works, however, were much more western than his Russian contemporaries as he effectively used both nationalistic folk melodies and international elements. Musically precocious, he began piano lessons at the age of five. In 1866, he was appointed professor of theory and harmony at the Moscow Conservatory, established that year. He held the post until approximately 1878. Tchaikovsky is perhaps most well known for his ballets. (1875–1876): Swan Lake, Op. 20. Tchaikovsky's first ballet was first performed (with some omissions) at the Bolshoi Theatre in Moscow in 1877. (1888–1889): The Sleeping Beauty, Op. 66. Tchaikovsky considered this work one of his best. Its first performance was in 1890 at the Mariinsky Theatre in Saint Petersburg, Russia. (1891–1892): The Nutcracker. Op. 71. Tchaikovsky himself was less satisfied with this, his last ballet. It was only in his last years, with his last two ballets, that his contemporaries came to really appreciate his qualities as ballet music composer.

# How long have you been with Ballet Arizona and what do you enjoy about dancing with the company?

I have been with Ballet Arizona for seven seasons. When I joined the company, I was in awe of the talent and diverse capabilities of the dancers. It was inspiring as a young professional to be able to learn from the other artists in the company and study the virtuosity of translating music into physical energy and storytelling. After seven seasons, I continue to draw inspiration from the amazing artists that I get to call my colleagues, and I love getting to share the stage with them and share this art form with our audience.

## What part of the 25/26 season are you most excited about?

I am looking forward to *The Sleeping Beauty*. Classical ballets like *The Sleeping Beauty* come with their own histories. There is a prestigious lineage of dancers that have danced the roles in this ballet, and it is exciting to be given the opportunity to carry that mantle.

## What is your favorite ballet to perform?

Of the ballets I have done, it is a tie between Myrtha from Giselle and the Waltz Girl in George Balanchine's Serenade. I had so much fun on stage in those roles.




## Welcome to *The Sleeping Beauty* performed by Ballet Arizona!

## Director Biographies



Daniela Cardim

Daniela began her career at Ballet of Municipal Theatre of Rio de Janeiro in 1994, becoming a soloist in 1995. She joined the Dutch National Ballet in 1999, performing key roles in ballets such as *The Sleeping Beauty* and *Romeo and Juliet*. She started choreographing as a young dancer and quickly gained recognition with works for the Dutch National Ballet like *Three Movements for Cello & Piano* and *Zaahir*. She was selected for the New York Choreographic Institute in 2008 and was named a

"New Name to Watch" by *Dance Europe Magazine* in 2015. She has created works for companies including Birmingham Royal Ballet, West Australian Ballet, New English Ballet Theatre, Dutch National Ballet - main and Junior companies, São Paulo Dance Company and Municipal Theatre of Rio de Janeiro. Cardim has also taught, mentored and choreographed at institutions like The Royal Ballet School, Elmhurst Ballet School and English National Ballet. After retiring as a dancer in 2010, she earned a first-class honors degree in arts management from London South Bank University. She has held various leadership roles at the New English Ballet Theatre and was named artistic director of Ballet Arizona in 2024.



Jami Kozemczak Executive Director

Jami Kozemczak was appointed Executive Director for Ballet Arizona in May 2022, after having served as the Director of Development since 2015. Kozemczak works to advance the organization through a peoplecentered leadership model that focuses on building culture, expanding programs, and increasing revenue generation. During her tenure, the organization has successfully implemented a culture of philanthropy that permeates throughout the organization. She has secured more than \$50 million in contributed

revenue during her time at Ballet Arizona, and increased earned revenue by 53% since her first year as Executive Director.

Kozemczak has 16 years of experience in arts non-profit management which includes fundraising, strategic planning, public relations, communications, donor relations, and marketing. Beginning her career as a marketing professional, she quickly transitioned to fundraising after discovering her true vocation was connecting donors to their passion. Jami holds a Bachelor's Degree in Political Science from Arizona State University. Jami's volunteer work centers on mentorship; she served on the AFP Professional Mentoring Program Committee for 7 years and has a passion for helping individuals invest in themselves and their future.

## Artistic Staff



#### Maria Simonetti, Rehearsal Director

Ms. Simonetti, a Buenos Aires native, trained at Teatro Colón and danced with La Joven Guardia of Ballet Nacional de Cuba before assisting Laura Alonso as stage director for Cuballet. She taught at several institutions, including the Magda Aunon School of Ballet and Pittsburgh's Point Park College, before becoming ballet mistress at Hubbard Street Dance Chicago in 1995. While assisting

choreographer Daniel Ezralow, she contributed to various productions, including Mandala and choreography for Pope John Paul II's International Youth Day. She has staged works for the Bratislava Dance Theatre and the National Ballet of Greece. In 1997, she became rehearsal director for Ballet Arizona while still working as a visiting artist, returning to Hubbard Street Dance Chicago each summer. Recently, she collaborated with Ib Andersen on Romeo & Juliet for Kansas City Ballet's 50th-anniversary season and served as a guest teacher for Nederlands Dans Theater.



#### **Lisbet Companioni,** Ballet Mistress

A native of Camagüey, Cuba, Lisbet Companioni began her career in ballet as a member of Ballet de Camagüey under the direction of its co-founder, Fernando Alonso. Her repertoire as a dancer includes Don Quixote, Dracula, La Bayadère, La Fille mal gardée, Napoli, and The Three Musketeers. In 2001 Companioni joined Ballet Arizona as a dancer and originated featured roles

in Ib Andersen's 2B, Elevations, Mosaik and Play. Her modern repertoire includes soloist roles in Twyla Tharp's Sinatra Suite, The Golden Section and Company B. Her interest in Balanchine ballets grew as she added George Balanchine's Agon, Apollo, Allegro Brillante, Serenade, and Theme and Variations to her repertory. Companioni has always had a passion for teaching and coaching dancers, and is also a faculty member at The School of Ballet Arizona. Companioni retired from the stage in 2008 to become Ballet Arizona's Ballet Mistress



#### David Krensing, Ballet Master

A Minnesota native and former Principal Dancer with Pennsylvania Ballet, David Krensing performed numerous leading classical, contemporary and modern dance roles by renowned choreographers. Mr. Krensing has toured the US and Europe, independently and as a PA Ballet dancer, and has been featured domestically and internationally in both company produced and

independent productions. Mr. Krensing holds a Bachelor of Fine Arts from Stephens College, and a Master of Fine Arts from The University of Arizona. In addition to his ballet master duties, he is a faculty member at The School of Ballet Arizona.



Michael Korsch, Lighting and Projection Design

Michael Korsch is a lighting, projection and scenic designer based in Philadelphia, PA, where he earned his BA in theatre from Temple University. He has worked with numerous directors and choreographers, creating hundreds of visual designs for dance, theatre and other live performances throughout North and South America, Europe, Asia, and Australia, as well as New Zealand.

Michael has been the resident lighting designer for Complexions Contemporary Ballet since 1998, and Ballet Arizona since 2001. extensively in the United States, Europe and Asia, with the Rochester Philharmonic, the Tucson Symphony, Opera National de Lorraine and the Orchestre Symphonique et Lyrique de Nancey, among others. Matthew is a former member of the Chicago Civic Orchestra. He holds degrees in violin performance from the Aaron Copland School of Music and the Chicago College of Performing Arts. Matthew also holds a Masters degree in Orchestral Conducting from the Aaron Copland School of Music.

With over 35 years experience in ballet, he has excelled in both classical and contemporary roles, including soloist and principal roles in major classics by Balanchine, Forsythe, and Kylian.

After retiring from performing, Payne served as Houston Ballet's company manager, co-founded

a student company and school in Texas, and choreographed five full-length and numerous one-act ballets. He has held roles including Philadelphia Ballet's School Director, Houston Ballet Academy faculty, and board member of the American Guild of Musical Artists. Currently, he is a Master Teacher, judge for YAGP, and repetiteur for Trey McIntyre, staging his ballets worldwide.



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
This endowed scholarship supports a portion of tuition for four to five students annually.


