

Ballet Arizona's new Driven to Dance program was created to make high-quality ballet training accessible to students in our local community, removing barriers and opening doors to professional arts education.







Ballet Arizona's Bussing Stipend Program was implemented to make arts education more accessible for school partners by addressing the rising cost of transportation for schools. Through this program, \$24,700 was awarded in travel stipends to aid in the cost of transportation to our Student Matinee and Performance Hour field trips.




